

Missional Assessment Tool

While we understand and trust the Spirit continues to work in our hearts, making us more in the likeness of Christ, we believe moments of reflection and assessment can guide our actions as we pursue growth.

This assessment explores a continuum of growth across three measures: witness, discipleship, and service. We understand God's calling for His people as consisting of these three measures, and invite you to prayerfully consider what your thoughts, feelings, and actions reflect in terms of where you are and where you feel God calling you next.

*On the next page, the boxes reflect increasing maturity and Kingdom-focus from left to right. Take some time to read the various options and check **all** boxes (across all columns) that most accurately reflect where you are in this season of life. When finished, assess your current strengths and weaknesses...what box best fits for each of the three measures?*
