### Children In Need

We know there is a great need in our community surrounding kids in foster care. Element has been approached by local Social Workers asking for help. We see support happening in three ways as we want to be a church that is FOR: all children, foster and kinship families, and reunification of children with bio parents, when safe. We are trying to support these groups in a few different ways.

- Providing Go-bags for babies (more details coming soon)
- Encouraging and helping people from Element to become a CASA worker
- Encouraging and helping people from Element to become a foster family
- Encouraging and helping people from Element be able to provide respite care for foster families
- Providing a safe and helpful monthly Replanted support group for foster and kinship families
- Element is also considering providing facility use for family visits, possibly providing classes for bio families, and other ways to bless specific needs in families.

### Neighborhood Restorative Justice Program

This program addresses low level first offender crimes by attempting to restore the victim, restore the community and educate and restore the offender. This program has seen success in Santa Barbara, and they are looking to start it here in Santa Maria. They need about 10 people to join their panel and be available either once a month or a few times a year. The panel collaboratively determines directives, such as restitution or apologies, to repair the harm caused. As a volunteer you get to work with others in your community, help offenders avoid repeating the mistakes that led to the original crime, and hopefully improve the quality of life in your community. Tom and Jing continue to serve all ages in their community through a variety of services and programs.

Their scholarship program has been going really well. The 20 teens are learning new skills and most importantly are being mentored by Tom and Jing and hearing the Gospel! **We just heard that 8 of them have accepted Jesus, which is not very common for this age in this area!**

We have been receiving individual updates about the students. Here is one amazing update from Jing: "His name is Num. He is 14 years old. He is high school 3. His parents separated when he was a little boy. He lives with his mother. He has one older brother. His older brother age is 20. Before Num and his older brother addicted to drugs and smoke. They were very thin. We prayed for them a lot in the prayer meeting. And when we went to the youth camp in Cheng mai, both of them stop using drugs and smoke from the second days we went to the youth camp. Till now both of them became a very good boys. They now go to Church every Sunday serving God at Church and help us in our children class on Saturday at our center sometime too. Praise the Lord! Thank you for the scholarship it's helpful for him." Thank you to those of you sponsoring a teen this school year! It is making a big difference.

Continue to pray for them and to pray that Tom and Jing continue to have the amazing strength, energy, and passion for their community to find Jesus, as they have this whole time! We continue to be amazed by their steadfastness and are thankful to be a part of what God is doing there in their community.

# HOW WE MAKE DECISIONS

## The Goal for our CP/WR Fund

As part of Element's generosity, we set aside (at minimum) 10% of donated income to a fund called Church Planting / World Relief. This money is to be generously given away to other churches, organizations, and people as God leads.

## Criteria for CP/WR donations:

### CHURCH PLANTS OR PLANTING NETWORK

It is our intent that roughly 50% (or more) of monies in this account be given away to another church, new church plants, or church planting networks that are working to build the calling of church planting.

### WORLD RELIEF

The remaining 50% of this fund aims to bring relief by meeting needs of people: physical, social, and emotional. While meeting the needs of others, we expect the ministries Element supports to have a strong sense of outreach and witness to make and grow disciples of Jesus. Our goal is not to fund mere social advocacy groups.

### Delta High School

God has placed us in a position to do good and advance the Kingdom of God in the lives of the staff and students at Delta. We see those as being part of the "the least of these," of whom Jesus spoke. God has placed us physically where we are (our neighborhood and community) for a reason. We desire to bless and make disciples. Financially supporting, investing, and donating money to the school, activities, events, and opportunities to meet needs on an individual basis.

### Pro-Life Organizations

Element is pro-life and desires to support the battles that are raging in our culture, including issues around abortion and human trafficking. There are many different issues we could focus on, outside of making disciples, but as of now this is our primary focus.

### Non-Religious, NGO, Aid

There will be times that requests will come from ministries where they knowingly admit that the goal is simply to meet a need, and do not intentionally move towards discipleship or witness. While some of this can be/should be important, for Element this falls in the category of helpful, but not where a large amount of energy and/or resources should be expended.

*Note: In addition to the CP/WR fund, Element has a Benevolence Fund built into the operating budget that is over and beyond the 10%. This set dollar amount is to help the individual person. This could be financial help with medical costs, rent/mortgage, a hotel night's stay, food donations, or other individual needs that might arise. Church members get priority from this fund, but it can also be used for nonmembers and people in our community who reach out for assistance.*

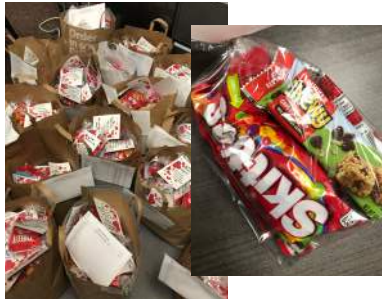
## New Donations:
